




SDG 11 Report: Sustainable Cities and Communities

City of Fez: Sustainable Heritage of Humanity

The choice to locate Euromed University in the city of Fez is not accidental. The cultural and historical dimension of this city, more than twelve centuries old. which is home to one of the oldest universities in the the Quaraouivne. world. embodies all the traditional values of human openness and cultural symbiosis of Morocco, based on mutual respect and influence of the region's cultural and civilizational differences.



Its medina, classified as a UNESCO World Heritage Site since 1980, is first and foremost a living museum of art and culture, where several creative activities coexist harmoniously, representing Moroccan craftsmanship in all its splendor. It is also a popular destination for tourists in search of spirituality and a major place of pilgrimage, particularly for African visitors, due to the symbolism of the place, a space of knowledge and religion, conferred on it by its medersas, mosques and mausoleums.

But beyond this fundamental cultural and historical aspect, Fez also constitutes an essential economic hub in the Moroccan development strategy. Fez's geostrategic position on the Moroccan motorway network, linking Tangier to Agadir, from north to south, and Casablanca to Oujda, from west to east, constitutes a nodal point in Morocco's logistics plan and the construction of the Maghreb motorway, which will link Nouakchott (Mauritania) to Tobruk (Libya).

Construction standards (UEMF Eco-Campus Note – Polyprogramme January 2014)

"The construction of the UEMF campus is firmly in line with the Union for the Mediterranean's exemplary policy in terms of sustainable development. The objective is the creation of an eco-campus. In this context, four priorities have been set: • Integration into the site, • Water and energy management, • Sustainability and ease of maintenance, • Comfort and health.

The performance levels set also take into account the objectives of cost compliance and flexibility. The concept of an eco-campus can be understood as a place of sustainable





development combining these three environmental, economic and social criteria. Thus, apart from the heritage policy in terms of environmental performance, the eco-campus also aims to develop social and economic orientations in accordance with sustainable development, namely: • The research topics developed, • The potential for technology transfer to be disseminated throughout the territory and to create local jobs, • Integration into the surrounding neighborhoods (student life, shared facilities, jobs and services), • The mix of populations, uses and activities.

For construction, the focus is on low-energy or passive buildings while maintaining comfort standards, for example with highly energy-efficient bioclimatic buildings that integrate renewable energy. Particular attention is paid to outdoor spaces:

• To the limitation of waterproofing (parking, roads), infiltration and storage of rainwater and runoff on site (ditches, basins, draining roads). • To plantations (woody plants, shrubs, lawns) whose needs in water, phytosanitary treatment and fertilization are limited. • To lighting and atmospheres. We are therefore approaching the criteria of the HQE approach, which makes it possible to define priorities in the environmental approach.

Remote work

Unable to offer on-campus learning during the lockdown periods, UEMF hastened to ensure academic continuity through distance learning. Digital platforms were installed, and all courses and administrative work were delivered. Limited travel to the partially closed campus was permitted, taking all precautions recommended by medical authorities. While lectures were delivered, it is clear that laboratory work requiring equipment suffered despite catchup classes.

Remote working is however permitted in limited cases (post covid) pending the regulations concerning it because it is not regulated by Moroccan law. Some texts have been adapted to this crisis context, but remote working remains a mode of organization without its own legal framework.

UEMF-community partnership

The UEMF is a privileged partner of the Fez-Meknes Regional Council, the city of Fez and the Regional Investment Council.

The University is also a partner with several rural communities and supports elected officials on sustainable development issues (training, student internships, impact studies, etc.)

Training

EMADU (Euro-Mediterranean School of Architecture, Design and Urban Planning)

EMADU is a joint venture between UEMF and the University of Florence, with the involvement of the Polytechnic University of Madrid and the École Nationale Supérieure des Arts Décoratifs (ENSAD Paris). Its mission is to train architects, designers, urban planners, landscape architects, and specialists in heritage conservation, particularly Euro-Mediterranean heritage. The School provides innovative training that combines the skills of architects and engineers to create profiles capable of better contributing to the design and organization of the living space of 21st-century citizens, while respecting quality and environmental standards.

Architecture & Urban Planning Department

The urban dynamics and economic and socio-spatial changes that our region is experiencing require mastery of urban space for the creation of sustainable environments, widely open to modernity, economic globalization, progress and human development;

Real estate programs and construction projects are more numerous, more complex, more diversified and require qualified architectural project management in sufficient numbers;

The requirements of sustainable development and taking into account environmental constraints require an upgrade of architectural techniques that respect the environment and ecology (new design of buildings, new techniques to reduce the energy needs of buildings, new materials, etc.);

National programs for the rehabilitation of architectural heritage and the preservation of historical monuments in Morocco and other countries of the Euro-Mediterranean area require qualified specialists in sufficient numbers.

Master: Urban planning and its territories

Objective:

- Work for respect for heritage and the environment, for differences and cultural specificities and develop in students an awareness of the demands of society, of individual and collective well-being;
- Promote professional expertise in the field of urban planning;
- Disseminate knowledge and promote the quality of urban production;

Executive Master in Transport Systems, Mobility and Territories

The study of mobility and transport systems is approached not only in a technical-economic context, but also through socio-political, cultural, institutional and environmental interactions.

The range of training modules offered aims to:

- Consolidate mastery of aspects related to transport modeling.
- Deepen understanding of the economic aspects of transport.
- Understanding the interaction between territory and transport.
- Integrate environmental and social aspects.

Master's in Transport and Sustainable Mobility

This training aims to provide students with the essential skills in transport and logistics in the face of the explosion in demand for transport and the importance of the challenges linked to mobility and urban logistics.

Various themes are covered, such as:

- Transport in the economy:
- Demand and costs (direct, indirect costs and negative externalities of transport);
- Organization of the offer;
- Transport-urban planning integration models (LUTI).

By teaching them to mobilize very varied fields of knowledge (engineering, economics, environmental sciences), the objective of this master's degree for our students is to allow them to resituate the different aspects on which they will be required to work by simultaneously taking into account the social, economic and environmental dimensions and by understanding the problems over the long term.

Faculty of Human and Social Sciences

Master: Management and promotion of tourism heritage

- To ensure that students receive excellent quality training in the management and promotion of heritage tourism through the dual diploma system made possible by the partnership between UEMF and the Institute for Research and Higher Studies in Tourism at Paris 1 Panthéon-Sorbonne.

UEMF promotes electric mobility! (May 6, 2022)

UEMF has entered into a new partnership with the Moroccan start-up "POGO", which consists of the development of soft and electric mobility within the UEMF eco-campus.

For an initial incubation phase, "POGO" deployed a fleet of 12 electric scooters for internal travel needs within the campus, in addition to 10 electric motorcycles for external travel.

POGO will benefit from the services offered by the UEMF incubator, namely technical assistance, individualized monitoring, access to technological platforms and access to the UEMF partner network.

Mobility Online Market For Optimized Trips - Benmoussa & Bennouna

Project selected following a call for tenders (AL-KHAWARIZMI Program) launched by the CNRST in partnership with the Digital Development Agency and the Ministries of Industry and Higher Education. Funding acquired 180,000 MAD

Project Summary: The mechanisms that control mobility are about to be profoundly disrupted by the intrusion of information technology, telecommunications, and, more recently, artificial intelligence (AI). These technological innovations will change both transportation needs and the means of meeting them, constituting a clear opportunity to resolve the difficulties that plague mobility.

The proposed AI application will enable better traffic flow management. Intelligent transportation will offer optimization opportunities and open up areas of choice that are currently understudied and underexplored, including schedule shifts and real-time modal transfers. This will result in increased elasticity of specific demands expressed at a given time on a given route.

This research project in transport, sustainable mobility and urban logistics is being carried out in the city of Casablanca with the participation of 4 professors, 3 doctoral students and in partnership with professional organizations such as Casa Transport SA and MobilizeYourCity.

Research work in progress

The Euromed Polytechnic School (EPS), an establishment of the Euromed University of Fez, is active, from an educational and research point of view, in various fields including sustainable development and green and smart mobility.

Artificial intelligence (AI) is becoming increasingly important in all sectors, including transportation, whether by sea, air, road, for passengers or goods.

More specifically, the use of AI applications in public transport could be one of the key solutions to improve the quality and efficiency of the public transport sector. Indeed, cities around the world are undergoing radical changes in their transport systems with the advent of technological advances such as autonomous vehicles, electric vehicles, vehicle-to-vehicle (V2V) communication, autopilot functions, and on-demand urban transport services.

Recent trends benefit from the proliferation of on-demand and shared services, which are increasing interest in intelligent transportation systems (ITS), smart mobility, and real-time network management as potential solutions to alleviate congestion problems.

Transportation researchers and practitioners have developed simulation models and tools for use in ITS planning, design, and operation. However, with new technologies based on big data processing, these techniques need to be upgraded and also include social and economic





considerations to comprehensively improve the performance of the transportation ecosystem.

Article 1:A study submitted to an indexed scientific journal dealing with the issue of transport was conducted highlighting a spatio-temporal analysis of traffic congestion patterns in Casablanca at the level of its 22 municipalities. Using different algorithms including K-means, Casablanca was subdivided into various zones qualified from "low congestion" to "highly congested" using various criteria, some commonly used, others much less. The generated model made it possible to identify the explanatory variables contributing to the increase in traffic congestion levels.

Article 2:The modal choice stage is a crucial element that experts rely on to design a valid and sustainable transport system. Various techniques are used to model modal choice behavior, including discrete choice models (DCMs) and machine learning (ML) techniques. Existing reviews mainly focus on DCMs or ML techniques. The main objective of this article is to cover the main discrete choice models and ML techniques while conducting an analysis on the accuracy of existing and so-called "hybrid" models.

International Conference on November 30 and December 1, 2022 held in Israelwith Shenkar College: "Moving forward with AI in Urban Mobility"

Mobility in large cities has been identified as one of the causes of growing dissatisfaction among residents, with a direct impact on their quality of life. Recently, due to new technological developments, cities are becoming "smart," and smart and sustainable mobility is gaining increasing importance. However, little is known about the effectiveness of smart mobility and how it can positively impact sustainability in everyday urban life. This conference aims to understand the behavioral intentions of potential transport users regarding their mobility choices and to identify the main perceived barriers that may prevent them from making more sustainable mobility decisions. The findings will provide a useful basis for the ideation phase, as part of a design process aimed at finding solutions capable of motivating users towards greener choices.

Tribune in Medias24 on the general theme of sustainable development: "Businesses and Climate Change: A Structural Relationship for a Clear Reduction in Carbon Emissions" by Prof. Othmane Benmoussa

Summary:

Do we still have time to stop climate change? How much room do we have for maneuver?

If the question seems scientifically, politically, and emotionally fraught, that's because it is, and it can be frightening and depressing for those unsure how to sustainably embrace the process of decarbonizing the economy as a whole. This doesn't mean, of course, that the actual answer is uncertain; the science is quite clear on this.

Indeed, the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) released a report in August 2021 that provided a sobering answer to the question: "We don't have time. We're out of time."

This statement should be interpreted with seriousness, indicating that we are at a pivotal moment in the future of future generations, in the sense that this does not mean that there is nothing more to be done or that our future is entirely out of our hands. Businesses and decision-makers can still and must take systemic actions to position our economy and our world on a truly more sustainable path.

Spending on arts and heritage

The UEMF devotes more than 5% of its budget to expenses including:

- operating expenses of libraries, galleries, exhibition spaces, theatres and spaces open to the public;
- expenditure on musical resources (instruments, payment of travel and music teachers, etc.);
- the regular operating costs of buildings dedicated to the arts and heritage.





Transport

The UEMF encourages and subsidizes more sustainable travel (walking, cycling, carpooling, public transport (UEMF buses and public shuttles), motorcycles, scooters or mopeds, or electric vehicles). In particular, travel expenses are better reimbursed in the case of carpooling.

The campus has priority pedestrian and cycle paths.

Sustainable housing for students and employees

The UEMF has an agreement with a large real estate development group in Fez which allowed it to build the U Village student residence (https://www.uvillage.ma/) Whoprovides its residents with a comfortable, warm, healthy, secure, and environmentally friendly living environment. Located in the heart of UEMF, U VILLAGE offers sustainable accommodation tailored to the needs of students and their budgets.

Affordable housing for employees

Access to decent housing is, according to the Moroccan Constitution, a right that guarantees the dignity and contributes to the social cohesion of citizens. Considered as such, the housing sector is a social sector by nature. In this sense, the Ministry of National Territorial Planning, Urban Planning, Housing and Urban Policy initiated the social housing program in 2010 at a cost of 250,000 MAD.

For employees wishing to acquire sustainable housing at affordable prices, the same developer has budget housing in various districts of the city of Fez.

Round table: advanced regionalization and new development model in the Fez-Meknes region



As part of the second part of the round tables organized by Horizon Press on advanced regionalization and the new development model, Professor Hicham Sebti took part in the panel of this edition under the theme: Challenges of Fez-Meknes for a new regional development policy.

During this debate, two panels were scheduled. The first focused on the actions of regional actors in the service of development, addressing issues that revolve around the governance of the Territory and the federation of regional actors, the assets of the Region including qualified human capital as well as major regional development projects and ambitious roadmaps to successfully meet the challenge of implementing the NMD. The School of Architecture, Design and Urban Planning (EMADU) of the Euromed University of Fez is kicking off the first edition of the ArtiSign Academic Biennial. The event will take place in the heart of the Fez medina, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, from Thursday, June 23 to Sunday, June 26, primarily at the historic site of Lalla Yedouna.

The ArtiSign Academic Biennial is an academic, inclusive, eclectic and international event involving internationally renowned artisans, designers, students, academics and professionals, with the aim of creating a new synergy with a holistic vision combining the world of Craft with that

of Design while celebrating the diversity of learning models.

This unifying event is part of the Royal vision to promote the tangible and intangible heritage of the city of Fez, to promote our ancestral know-how by making it one of our socio-economic levers and to bring the academic world closer to the world of craftsmanship to innovate and internationalize Moroccan knowledge and know-how and made in Morocco.

To this end, a tripartite agreement initiated by the Wilaya of Fez-Meknes was signed between the UEMF, ADER-Fez and the Fez-Meknes Chamber of Crafts as part of the program for the requalification and rehabilitation of the Medina of Fez aimed at promoting ancestral knowledge and know-how as well as the valorization of Moroccan artisanal heritage and the revitalization of traditional trades. VERNACULAR ARCHITECTURE IN MOROCCO: Intensive Workshop on the Medina of Sefrou December 18-20, 2022

This international workshop includes the identification of a case study of vernacular architecture in the Euro-Mediterranean area (here it is the Medina of Sefrou). The workshop is characterized by an interdisciplinary approach based on the integration of different levels of analysis: ethnographic, geographical, climatic, environmental, historical, geomatic, constructive, energetic, economic and organizational.

The objective of this workshop is to introduce students to the use of methods and tools for the analysis of vernacular architecture and to understand the relationship between environment, culture, local architecture and development.







URBAN PLANNING & ARCHITECTURE WORKSHOP December 20-23, 2022

The objective of the workshop is to implement and implement the complete urban planning process (including the regulatory one in force in Morocco). From there, and according to a hierarchical sequence of urban planning documents and scales, the urban development project will emerge. The outcome of this staging of the planning approach and tools would obviously be the architectural project. Said architectural project would be a unifying urban facility of cohesion, emanating from the realistic urban problem of Fez, namely, urban fragmentation.

CLUB WE GREEN IN ACTION: "ENHANCING IFRANE NATIONAL PARK: LET'S OPEN OUR EYES!"



Saturday, October 28, 2023; the "We Green" club of students from the Euromed University of Fez (UEMF) organized an awareness day for its members through visits to several environmental centers as well as a clean-up action in the Ifrane National Park.

As part of these social activities, the "We Green" club kicked off this day aimed at raising public awareness of environmental issues with the main objective of: Encouraging reflection on environmental issues, creating ecological habits through a cleaning action and awareness of biodiversity issues through a visit to the Ifrane National Park, its fish farming station in Ras El Mae and its cedar house. The day was marked in particular by a cleaning action in the forest of the Zerouka I lake in Ifrane with the ambition of reducing the negative impact of waste and residues that affect the environment.

Note that Zerrouka I is a small, shallow, drainable artificial fish pond. It is located on the Zerrouka (or Zrouka) wadi, the main tributary of the Tizguite wadi. The dike is about 300m from the spring, so its waters flow directly into it. The reservoir is limited by a concrete wall, at least on the west bank. The spring waters are also used to supply the city of Ifrane with drinking water.

At the level of this body of water which is an integral part of the Ramsar Site of Oued Tizguite; the vegetation is not very varied (around fifteen species with a wide geographical distribution) and very limited in space, the edges of the lake being concreted and mowing is frequent there.

It is a fairly sheltered trout lake, somewhat interesting for birds. It is home to few wintering birds (less than 400 birds), the population being composed mainly of divers: coots and crested coots, little grebes, pochards, tufted ducks and ferruginous wagtails, with occasional shovelers and/or mallards. Among the breeders, the common coot (20-25 pairs), the crested coot (about 10 pairs) and the little grebe (5-8 pairs) are the most regular.





Finally, it should be noted that the Euromed University of Fez is a public utility, non-profit institution with an eco-campus that meets international standards and provides a pleasant and stimulating environment for its students from more than 40 nationalities.

UEMF graduates are equipped with training in soft skills, study skills, life skills and professional skills and this profile; based on several pillars; allows students to acquire numerous skills related in particular to multilingualism, multiculturalism, innovation and entrepreneurship, the digital environment, international mobility, and sustainable development in addition to the pillar of social responsibility and eco-citizenship through which students are instilled with the values of respect for the environment, sustainable development and civic responsibility.

As part of its ongoing efforts to build the capacity of local stakeholders and improve the performance of public services, the Euromed University of Fez, under the supervision of the Fez-Meknes Regional Council, organized a training workshop on the theme of administrative policing on Wednesday, May 14 and Thursday, May 15. This workshop is part of the Continuing Education Master Plan, led by the University, which aims to equip elected officials and strengthen their skills to meet the requirements of modern territorial governance.

The workshop also provided an opportunity to delve deeper into the legal and regulatory frameworks governing the missions of the administrative police, to examine the municipality's intervention mechanisms, its areas of action, as well as the principles of balance between the preservation of public order and respect for individual rights.



A truly immersive journey, the exhibition offers an exploration between past and future, integrating advanced technologies developed by UEMF research laboratories, such as virtual reality. Structured into several rooms, it highlights the historical role of Al Quaraouiyine and the madrasas in the transmission of knowledge (Circuit du Savoir), the use of technologies to preserve and promote heritage (Tech & Heritage), the dialogue between traditional crafts and academic research (Tech & Craft), as well as a collaborative FabLab (El Beldi FabLab) bringing together artisans, students, and researchers. The UEMF promotes a vision of the medina as an "open-air school," where learning, tangible heritage, and know-how meet. The annex also hosts international events, such as the Pan-African summer school "Nomadic African Studio" (July 18 – August 15, 2025), highlighting its openness to cultural exchange and transdisciplinary training.


